

Christian Science (Church of Christ, Scientist)

Christian Science is a Christian denomination founded in the 19th century by Mary Baker Eddy. It emphasizes the spiritual nature of reality and the power of prayer for healing.

Core Beliefs:

- **God as All-in-all:** Christian Science teaches that God is the only cause and creator, and that God is good, all-powerful, and all-knowing.
- **Spiritual Reality:** The core belief is that reality is fundamentally spiritual, and that physical ailments are illusions stemming from a misunderstanding of God and His creation.
- **Healing through Prayer:** Christian Scientists believe that prayer based on an understanding of God's laws can heal sickness and disease.
- **Jesus as Exemplar:** Jesus Christ is seen as the ultimate example of spiritual healing and a demonstration of God's power.

Practices and Rituals:

- **Sunday Services:** Sunday services typically include readings from the Bible and *Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures*, Mary Baker Eddy's primary text.
- **Testimony Meetings:** These gatherings provide opportunities for members to share their experiences of spiritual healing.
- **Reading Rooms:** Christian Science Reading Rooms offer access to Christian Science literature and provide a place for prayer and study.

- **Church of Christ, Scientist:** Christian Science churches are often called "branches."

- **Democratic:** Christian Science has a democratic structure with elected officers at the local and international levels.
- **Board of Directors:** The Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Massachusetts, serves as the governing body of the denomination.

Main Symbols:

- **The Cross and Crown:** A symbol representing the triumph of spirit over matter.
