The Church of God in Christ (COGIC) is a predominantly African American Pentecostal Christian denomination.

- **Origins:** Founded in 1897 in Arkansas, COGIC emerged from a merger of smaller holiness-pentecostal groups.
- **Key Figures:** Charles Price Jones and Charles Harrison Mason are considered the founders of COGIC.

### Core Beliefs:
